

OUR GREEN TRACK RECORD

If elected David and Peter will be joining an industrious and effective team at Suffolk County Council. As well as being community focused, working hard for residents, Green councillors have also been highly effective in influencing County Council Policy including:

- Ensuring a Climate Emergency was declared, with a commitment to be carbon neutral by 2030
- Getting a Biodiversity Strategy agreed for the whole of Suffolk
- Securing a Carbon Budget for Suffolk County Council. This means SCC will have to measure and reduce carbon emissions and provide a yearly public statement alongside the financial budget
- Protecting trees by ensuring Suffolk County Council has signed the Tree Charter
- Successfully working cross-party to increase Special Educational Needs and Disability provision across Suffolk including the new school in Bungay for children with communication needs
- Ensuring Increased cycle provision, a cycle strategy and funding across Suffolk

LOCAL GREENS GET THINGS DONE

- Helped with food packages and sign posting for the Supporting Lowestoft group during the Covid pandemic
- Organised litter picking which is currently ongoing within Oulton



- David and Peter initiated a motion passed by Lowestoft Town Council to declare a Climate Emergency, enabling the development of policies to mitigate climate change. David and Peter sit on the council's Climate Emergency committee which ensures they can contribute to these council policy proposals.
